## 'FRIENDS' SHOW JUST WHAT CAN BE DONE

When a group of local people got together last year and decided to do something to try and improve their community and estate, the Friends of Jubilee Fields Estate was the result. Over recent months, this group of committed residents have been meeting monthly at Chestnut Close Communal Lounge to explore ideas which will improve the Jubilee Fields Estate for the benefit of everyone living there.

The group's first project will be to create a health and wellbeing garden this summer for those using the communal lounge, such as the Dementia Café, to utilise and enjoy. With help from the Probation Service's Community Payback Scheme and Livin housing, group members are creating a special space for outdoor activities; somewhere to learn gardening skills and a place to just sit and relax with others. Improvements have already been made to the landscaped areas of Chestnut Close with old shrubs and weeds removed, new planting and low maintenance landscaping introduced.
